2:3 FORM AND MEANING

A. INTRODUCTION

- 1. FORM is the perceivable shape.
- 2. MEANING is what the shape symbolizes to those who use it in a particular society.

B. PRINCIPLES OF FORM/MEANING CORRESPONDENCE

- 1. MEANINGS ARE COMMUNICATED TO HUMAN BEINGS ONLY THROUGH CULTURAL FORMS
 - a. Verbal
 - b. Non-verbal
- 2. A CULTURAL FORM BORROWED FROM ONE CULTURE BY ANOTHER WILL HAVE AT LEAST SOME DIFFERENT MEANINGS IN THE NEW CULTURE

Material	Shoes	(A) U.S.
Culture		(B) Africa

3. THE SAME FORM IN DIFFERENT CULTURES WILL HAVE DIFFERENT MEANINGS

Legs (B) Jordan

- 4. WE MUST FIND THE PROPER CULTURAL FORMS OR THE MEANINGS WILL BE WRONG
 - (1) Bible Translations
 - Formal Correspondence Equivalent
 - Dynamic Equivalent
 - (2) Unclear Meanings
